

# TO THE READERS AND AUTHORS OF THE “AUREA IURIS ROMANI” JOURNAL

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Aurea iuris romani represents the activities of the Interuniversity Centre for the Study of Roman law and Romanistic Tradition with University of National and World Economy, Sofia, and relies entirely of the University support.

*Aurea iuris romani* is a review about Roman law and Legal history, but also about the studies of any legal systems from Antiquity, Medieval times, or Humanism and even modern times, related somehow to the History of law. It is a forum for discussion and articles, reviews, announcements, materials. The journal gives an opportunity to young and advanced national and foreign scholars to publish the results of their original research. We accept articles on English, French, Bulgarian, Italian, Russian, German, Spanish languages.

The articles shall be subject to peer review:

The texts in the following fields shall not go through peer review:

Discussions (actual and arguable issues of doctrine, legislation);

Reviews;

Scientific events (conferences, anniversary meetings, etc.).

The manuscripts that are subject to peer review shall be evaluated by at least two qualified specialists who give an opinion whether the journal should accept the manuscript. The reviewers, who are not aware of the author's name, may directly accept the manuscript for publication or may return it with recommendation for further revision, or may suggest that the manuscript should not be published.

All accepted for publication materials shall go through scientific, grammar and language editing and shall be published after consulting the final content and text formatting of the manuscript with the authors.

Format of the content of the manuscripts

The volume of an article should be up to 20 standard pages – one page should contain 1800 characters with spaces, footnotes included). It also accepts critically evaluating materials, the volume of which should be up to 10 standard pages, as well as other materials such as reviews of books and

other materials, presentation of court practice, of legislative amendments, legal practice problems of up to 5 standard pages in size.

The texts should study a specific scientific problem by offering an original position or solving a practical problem. This study should have also a review of other researchers' accomplishments on the topic. Besides, analytical overviews may also be presented.

The articles should be submitted using MS Office 2003 (or higher version), the font Times New Roman, size 12 (including Latin and Ancient Greek). The text should be aligned on both sides with line spacing of 1.5.

The first page of the manuscript should contain the following information in the same consecutive order: title, first name and last name of the author, science degree and scientific position, and a footnote should present shortly the author in Bulgarian and in English language (up to 40 words), together with his/her e-mail address; besides, there should be presented in English language a summary of 300 words, together with keywords in English.

The list of literature should be placed after the main text, starting with the titles in Cyrillic alphabet, then in Latin alphabet following the citing and transliteration rules. You can use the following instrument for online transliteration:[https://www.lexilogos.com/keyboard/bulgarian\\_conversion.htm](https://www.lexilogos.com/keyboard/bulgarian_conversion.htm).

The article should hold the following information:

Transliterated article's title and author's name in Latin, if it is not written on language, using Latin characters.

Example:

Rimsko chastno pravo  
prof. Mihail Andreev

The title, given name and last name of the author, the summary and the keywords in English.

The author is responsible for the accuracy of the translation and transliteration.

It is recommended that the presented text consists of an introduction, explanation of the methodology, description of the study and the results and a conclusion.

Footnotes must be consecutively numbered with Arabic numbers. All the graphics and diagrams must be marked as figures, consecutively numbered by Arabic numbers. The title should be written under the figure. The tables must be consecutively numbered by Arabic numbers and with titles (above the tables). The source of the data in the table should be indicated under the table.

When citing publications of other authors, the following rules should be observed. When a specific text from other author's publication is used, the pages must be indicated: The first quotation should contain Family name, First letter of the first name, and later the abbreviated quotation Pavlov, C. (2002) p. 333 states that „...". When no specific text is cited, then the following structure should be used: Pavlov, C. (2002) confirms the thesis about the existence of causality.

If a sentence makes mention of several authors, they have to be cited: Petrov (2000) and Roger (2002) also prove, that... In case of more than one publication by a single author, the citing is as follows: As Johnson (1991; 1997) offers..... or Researches, made in the 1990s (Lionel, 1991; 1997) show, that ..... If several publications of one and the same year by one and the same author are cited, after the year shall be put letter a, b, c, etc.

Example: A previous study by Vincent (1990a) shows that ..., although in a later study the problem is further explored (Vincent, 1990b).

When citing secondary sources, the following structure should be used: According to the research made by Willson (2000, as cited in Smith, 2004, p. 120) .....

The list of cited sources should be placed after the main text, without numbering. The sources have to be alphabetically ordered according to the last name of the authors, starting with titles in Cyrillic alphabet, then in Latin alphabet, then in other alphabets.

Under each cited source in Cyrillic (in the Bulgarian language), the source should be transliterated.

#### Articles in print periodicals and magazines

The following format should be used: last name, first initial, year published with parentheses, comma, article title, comma, journal title (in italics), comma, the volume, the year of publication with parentheses, comma, pages.

#### Example

Armour, J., and Fleischer, H., and Knapp, V., and Winner, M. Brexit and Corporate Citizenship, *European Business Organization Law Review*, 2 (2017).

The information in Cyrillic should be transliterated.

#### Monographs

The following format should be used: last name, first initial, year published and placed in parentheses, comma, the title in italic script, comma, name of the publisher, comma, place of the edition and the year without parentheses, comma, pages.

### Example

Герджиков, О. *Търговски сделки*. 4-то изд. София 2015, 55 и сл.

The data in Cyrillic should be transliterated.

Gerdžikov, O. *Tărgovski sdelki*, 4-to izd., Sofija 2015, 55 i sl.

If there are multiple sources by one and the same author, then citations are listed in order by adding little letters a, b, c, etc. after the year of publication.

About the electronic sources

If a website is used as a source, the information shall be put in the following order:

source, year, title of the web document or the web page [medium], available at: website address/URL[Date of last access]

In the footnotes should be used short citation: Armour, J et al. (2017).

Example: American Economic Association, 2012. JEL Classification Codes Guide, [online] Available at: <<http://www.aeaweb.org/jel/guide> [Accessed 15 May 2012].

For the non-mentioned sources there can be used the Harvard citation system (<https://im.tu-sf.org/bg/for-authors/harvard-style-menu.html>).

The manuscripts should be presented in a disc and in 2 printed copies. On the disc you should handwrite your name, the software you have used and the name of the file containing your manuscript.

Please, make sure that the disc file and the printed copy are identical.

The manuscripts which do not meet the requirements, listed above in points 2 to 5, shall be returned to the authors for revision. The manuscripts are reviewed and the decision for their publishing, return for revision or rejection is taken by the Editorial Board. The Editorial Board informs the authors about the taken decision.

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
