This study should have also a review of other researchers' accomplishments on the topic. Besides, analytical overviews may also be presented.

The articles should be submitted using MS Office 2003 (or higher version), the font Times New Roman, size 12 (including Latin and Ancient Greek). The text should be aligned on both sides with line spacing of 1.5.
